Indigenous Peoples Task Force (IPTF) is a Native American provider of HIV education and direct services to the Native community in Minnesota. Provides culturally appropriate programs to prevent further transmission of HIV, increase access to traditional and western medical services, and improve the quality of life for clients, families, and communities. IPTF also offers a housing program offering a small community consisting of 14 housing units that provide affordable housing to people living with HIV and their families. There are various unit sizes, ranging from efficiency studios to 4-bedroom units. Residents must have an HIV case manager and meet income guidelines in order to apply for the program. All units are wheelchair accessible.

Residents pay all utility bills, plus 30% of gross income as rent. Individuals do not need to be a current client of IPTF in order to apply for the housing program.

Our classes are conducted by certified aerobic instructors with over 20 years of combined experience. All classes are free and open to the public. A once a year registration fee is charged for all participants.

Twin Cities African American Church HIV Prevention Project the HIV/AIDS Prevention Program is conducted through a collaborative model with African American Churches. Community Fitness Today conducts outreach programs in 20 churches throughout Minneapolis and St. Paul, presents HIV prevention workshops, trains church members to become prevention instructors, and provides customized support services to community members living with HIV/AIDS.

Care Advocacy for persons diagnosed with HIV/AIDS who are not receiving case management but need short term provision of advice and assistance in obtaining medical, housing, nutritional, social, community, legal, financial and other needed services.

Dwight Henry McWilliams (DHM) Emotional Support Group for males infected with HIV/AIDS who come together monthly to share their experience of living with the disease. This group consists of guest speakers, discussion topics such as medication adherence, HIV/AIDS education, risk reduction, and mental health issues.

Services provided; The YMCA offers a variety of fitness and community building programs that you may tailor to your own personal fitness needs. There are no HIV

specific programs available, however, they offer a diverse, non-discriminatory atmosphere and do not require HIV status disclosure.

Insurance/cost: Membership rates are as follows; Single-\$55/month, Double-\$84/month & Family-\$94/month

Scholarships are available to subsidize the cost of membership and are available through an open application process. Up to 75% of membership costs may be deducted based on income. Be prepared to fill out an application, provide tax return, 1 month pay stub, or a letter on official business letter stating your employment/income status. You may call individual branches or visit the website for more information.

Fitness reimbursement programs are also offered by HealthPartners®, Medica, and Blue Cross and Blue Shield of MN. YMCA members in a qualifying plan can receive a \$20 per month reimbursement if they work out 8 days or more per month. Two adults may participate with HealthPartners® and BCBS for a total reimbursement of \$40 per month. HealthPartners® Freedom Medicare Plan participants can receive full reimbursement of monthly YMCA membership fees if they work out 8 days or more. Open Arms will arrange meal deliveries that fit each client's nutritional needs and schedule. Deliveries occur weekdays between 11 a.m. and 1 p.m. Client must be home to receive meals or arrange to have someone receive them. For safety reasons, meals are not left unattended. Volunteers help with office work and with preparation and delivery of meals. Office hours are Monday -Friday 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. To be eligible you must live in the Twin Cities metropolitan area and have proof of HIV diagnosis, or be a full-time caregiver, partner, or immediate family member of a person living with HIV. Call for more details.
